



Clinician Educator – General Cardiologist for South Asian Preventive Cardiology Clinic
Division of Cardiovascular Medicine, Department of Medicine

The Department of Medicine, Division of Cardiovascular Medicine, at Stanford Medicine is seeking a board certified or board eligible non-invasive cardiologist in the Clinician Educator line. This physician will be primarily based at Stanford Health Care in San Jose and Santa Clara, as well as in its outreach clinics in the greater Bay Area. Primary clinical activities will support the Stanford South Asian Translational Heart Initiative (SSATHI), which is a clinic and research program dedicated to cardiovascular risk detection and treatment in the Bay Area South Asian population. The SSATHI clinic was established in 2014 and sees patients from a local, national, and international draw. Clinical activities will include aggressive screening of South Asians for active and subclinical cardiovascular disease, treatment of existing or discovered cardiovascular disease, as well as aggressive screening for and treatment of cardiovascular risk factors, including but not limited to: dyslipidemia, diabetes, prediabetes, insulin resistance, hypertension, and metabolic syndrome. The physician will also promote SSATHI's clinical offerings to South Bay Area provider networks, employers, and patient groups.

This physician will actively participate, with ample coordinator support, in enrolling patients in ongoing clinical and translational research studies that study fundamental mechanisms of cardiovascular risk, as well as deployment of new digital health technologies aimed at reducing the South Asian cardiovascular disease burden.

The successful candidate will be expected to teach medical students, residents and fellows in the clinical setting. Candidates with experience and interest in clinical research, with particular interest in South Asian cardiovascular health, are preferred. The ranks of Clinical Professor, Clinical Associate Professor, or Clinical Assistant Professor, will be based on training and experience.

The major criterion for appointment, reappointment and promotion for Clinician Educators is excellence in the overall mix of clinical care and clinical teaching appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill.
