The Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology in the Department of Medicine at Stanford University is recruiting an Assistant or Associate Professor to join the Division in the Medical Center Line.

The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the Medical Center Line shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, and scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine.

At Stanford the connection of science to clinical care is a priority. Creating new, cost-effective medical devices that improve patient care requires a collaborative approach that focuses on the needs of patients, physicians and the health care industry as a whole. The candidate should have appropriate training and/or a strong interest in the use of advances in technologies to improve patient care and outcomes.

It is also expected that the successful applicant will be a gastroenterologist who has completed training in the past ten years with a record of clinical service, research and teaching. In addition, the candidate is expected to have demonstrated ability to collaborate across disciplines, engagement in national GI professional societies and publication records to portend strong academic potential.

The candidate must hold an MD and be board certified or eligible in gastroenterology, and possess or be able to obtain a California medical license at the time of appointment. The selected candidate will join a collegial team of dedicated and talented physicians and staff thriving in a dynamic clinical practice with cutting-edge technology.
