The Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology in the Department of Medicine at Stanford University seeks a board-certified hepatologist to join the Division as an Associate Professor or Professor in the University Tenure Line or Medical Center Line.

The predominant criterion for appointment in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to research and teaching. The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the Medical Center Line shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. Faculty rank will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.

The successful applicant should hold the current academic rank of Associate Professor or Professor (or equivalent) with an established record of externally funded translational or laboratory research, have a national reputation in hepatology, have at least 10 years of experience in the practice of hepatology, have an MD, be board certified in hepatology, possess or be able to obtain a California medical license, and be qualified for appointment to a faculty position at Stanford University.

We expect the successful candidate to enhance the research portfolio of the division to include translational or basic science research in liver, with specific areas of research including but not limited to inflammation, fibrosis or cancer. The candidate will also participate in the guidance of the hepatology program as well as provision of cutting-edge, high quality care to patients with liver disease collaborating with colleagues in Surgery and other specialties. Finally, the candidate will be expected to contribute actively to the educational mission of the Division.
