

The Department of Medicine at the Stanford University School of Medicine is recruiting a Chief for the Division of Hematology to lead the research, clinical and educational activities of the Division. The faculty position is at the Associate or Professor level in the University Tenure Line or Medical Center Line. We are seeking a candidate who combines proven leadership skills with an outstanding record of academic accomplishment, a dedication to excellence in the clinical, research and educational missions, an understanding of the complexity of academic medicine, and the creative vision to develop a premier Division of Hematology. Candidates should be accomplished physician investigators with a national/ international reputation. Candidates should be Board Certified in Hematology. The Chief will be expected to recruit additional faculty to support both laboratory and clinical research and to expand the clinical enterprise. The Chief is also expected to strengthen the fellowship program and increase its focus on the research opportunities so prevalent at Stanford.

The predominant criterion for appointment in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to research and teaching. The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the Medical Center Line shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care or programmatic development, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. Faculty rank will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.
