The Department of Medicine at the Stanford University School of Medicine is recruiting a Chief for the new Division of Hospital Medicine to lead the research, educational activities and delivery of inpatient clinical medicine of the Division. This Division includes the academic hospitalists, Bedside Medicine group, the Stanford 25 group, and nurse-scientists working in SHC in research positions. The faculty position is at the Associate or Professor level in the University Tenure Line, Medical Center Line or Clinician-Educator Line. The Department of Medicine's goal is to develop a premier Division of Hospital Medicine and continue the tradition of outstanding research, while building the clinical program. We are seeking a candidate who combines proven leadership skills with an outstanding record of academic accomplishment, a dedication to excellence in the clinical, research and educational missions, an understanding of the complexity of academic medicine. Candidates should be accomplished physician- investigators with a national/international reputation. Candidates should be Board Certified in Internal Medicine. The Chief will be expected to lead the research, educational activities and delivery of inpatient clinical medicine of the Division. The Chief will also be expected to recruit additional faculty to support both laboratory and clinical research and to expand the clinical enterprise. The Chief is also expected to establish a research focus with this new division; taking full advantage of the diverse clinical research opportunities available at Stanford (including investigations surrounding quality of care)

The predominant criterion for appointment in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to research and teaching. The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the Medical Center Line shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care or programmatic development, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. The Clinician Educator Line is primarily defined by engagement in clinical care and teaching that advances clinical medicine. Faculty rank will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.
