



The Department of Medicine at Stanford University, Division of Primary Care and Population Health, Section of Geriatrics seeks health services investigators to join the Department at the Assistant Professor or Associate Professor level in the University Tenure Line (UTL) or Medical Center Line (MCL). Applicants are required to have either an MD or other degree allowing clinical practice. Successful candidates should have a substantial research potential or portfolio commensurate with rank and experience. They should have a geriatric focus to their research and educational efforts and have a geriatric focus to their clinical work. They will also be expected to contribute to our mission through education and teaching including training and mentoring of Clinician Educators, Geriatric Medicine fellows, and trainees and faculty from other sections and divisions interested in research in care of older adults within the Stanford University School of Medicine.

The predominant criteria for appointment in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to and excellence in research and teaching. The major criteria for appointment in the Medical Center Line shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fill. Faculty rank and line will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.

The successful candidate should be either a physician or doctoral level researcher with other clinical qualifications. Clinicians should have a board certification or be board eligible in internal medicine, family practice, or a related subspecialty (e.g., geriatrics, palliative medicine) and successful applicants will have a growing track record of publication and funding commensurate with experience.
