The Division of Oncology in the Department of Medicine at Stanford University is seeking applicants for an Assistant Professor position in the Medical Center Line (MCL). The successful candidate should be a trained clinical investigator with a demonstrated track record or the trajectory to secure research funding and a strong publication record.

The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the MCL shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service—appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. Candidates should have an MD or MD/PhD and be board certified or eligible in Oncology or Hematology/Oncology or related specialties.

Individuals appointed as Assistant Professors will have completed their house staff training and, where appropriate, postdoctoral fellowship training. They must demonstrate excellence or promise of excellence in the overall mix of contributions in clinical care, teaching and scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine appropriate to the programmatic need upon which the appointment will be based. There should be evidence that candidates have the promise to attain *regional* recognition for excellence in the overall mix of contributions. If these individuals have not had formal teaching experience, they should have demonstrated during their house staff and fellowship training a commitment to teaching, and they should have the potential to meet or exceed acceptable standards in teaching.

The Breast Oncology group seeks a junior faculty member to establish new clinical and/or clinical/translational research collaborations and to conduct clinical or clinical/translational trials focused on breast malignancies. The candidate will teach fellows and other trainees and participate in the Oncology clinics and accompanying tumor board. The Division of Oncology benefits from an outstanding scientific and clinical environment at Stanford, including active collaborations with the basic science departments and the Stanford Institutes.
